INDESCRIBABLE SUFFERINGS on begin to understand how much the

There is no way we can even begin to understand how much the blessed Savior suffered, body and soul, to save His people from our sins. The sword of divine vengeance was unsheathed against the holy Son of God, not for any crimes that He had done, but for the crimes of His people. "Awake, O sword, against my shepherd, and against the man that is my fellow, saith the LORD of hosts: smite the shepherd, and the sheep shall be scattered: and I will turn mine hand upon the little ones" (Zechariah 13:7). Paul declared to the people of Thessalonica that "Christ must needs have suffered, and risen again from the dead" (Acts 17:3). The reason He had to suffer, bleed and die is because He had assumed the place of His people from before the foundation of the world, though He knew we would fall into sin through Adam's transgression. He took the place of the guilty, making Himself accountable for our iniquities, therefore He must endure the just consequences for all of our sins against the Lord. Christ our Savior willingly took our place in order to endure the wrath and vengeance of God against our transgressions which divine justice required. "The soul that sinneth, it shall die" (Ezekiel 18:4). In those hours upon the cross, our Substitute bore up under the anger of God against sin. None can know the fulness of the curse of the broken law but the law-Giver and the law-Satisfier. None can know what horrific punishment is the due reward for sin except Him who poured it out and that blessed One who bore up under the wrath until no vengeance or judgment was left for His people. When Peter was ready to defend the Savior with the sword, the Master said in John 18:11: "Put up thy sword into the sheath: the cup which my Father hath given me, shall I not drink it?" We are assured that the Savior drank that cup of wrath down to its last bitter dregs, therefore, no wrath remains for His people. "There is therefore now no condemnation to them who are in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:1). There can be no judgment for those in whose stead the Savior suffered, bled, died and arose. —Pastor Jim Byrd -**-**O--
